The tunes allow you to customize your iPhone with tunes and sounds that you like, even allowing you to assign specific tunes to different contacts. The easiest way to add a ringtone to your iPhone is to buy it on the iTunes Store, usually for 99 cents or \$1.29. But if you prefer not to spend money, create free tunes using songs you already have, or visit a website that offers free, legal tunes to download. The information in this article applies to any iPhone. While it takes some effort, you can create a new ringtone from a song you already have in your iTunes library. To do this, select a song that is stored on your local hard drive; your song can't be in the cloud or streaming from the internet. You can't create tunes from songs in your library that were downloaded with Apple Music; the song must be purchased on iTunes or imported from the CD you have. Identify the song in your iTunes library. The maximum length of the ringtone is 40 seconds; for text message tones, the maximum length is 30 seconds. Mac Users: Choose iTunes's preferences for the total. Windows Users: Choose to edit the preferences of the common. At the bottom of the window, click Import Settings. In the Import Settings window, go to the drop-off option. (Note which setup is being selected so you can return at the end of the process and restore it to your original choice.) Choose high quality (128 kbps) from the menu and then select OK. Make sure you also have an AAC selected as an import format if it hasn't yet. Find your song in the iTunes library. Listen to it and mark the start and end of the times the clip you want to make in the ringtone. Click the right button and select Song Info. Select the Options tab. Enter the start and stop times marked in the available fields. Choose OK. In the iTunes menu, select the a>t; a conversion file for the AAC version. This will create a new file with just a clip between start and stop once you install. Find a newly created clip file on iTunes (it will have the same name as the original song, but with a short time). Click the right button on the new file and select Show in Finder. In the Finder window, click the right button on the new file and select Rename. Change the extension from m4a to m4r (m4r is a file extension for tunes) and click Enter. Now you've created a new ringtone! You won't need a clip in the iTunes library, so you can delete it. On iTunes, click the new file name on the right and select Delete from the library. When asked if you want to remove this song from the iTunes library, select Delete the Song. When you were asked if you wanted to move the song to the basket, Keep File. When you're done creating a ringtone, go back and delete the start time and stop the original song and restore the original import settings. In the iTunes library, select the original song file. Click the right button on the song and and Song Info. Click on the Options tab and unhindered boxes nearby to start and stop. Click OK. Next, restore changes to import settings. Select iTunes (on Mac) or Edit (on Windows PC) Select Import Settings. Select Settings and select the original option. Now that you've created your ringtone file, add it to your iPhone. Connect your iPhone to your computer. (Unlock the iPhone if asked.) At the top of the iTunes window, select your iPhone. In the left sidebar, under on My Device, select tones. If the left sidebar isn't visible on iTunes, select the Show sidebar. From the Finder window, drag the new m4r ringtone to iTunes and drop it in the Tones folder. At the bottom of the iTunes window, select Sync. When the synchronization is finished, your new ringtone will be next to all the other tunes on your iPhone. If you want to go beyond iTunes, there are websites that offer ringtones for free. The problem, however, is making sure that your source is indeed both free and legal (not limited to copyright use). Here are a few websites that offer legally free tunes. These sites also offer other content such as videos, games, apps and wallpapers. The zedge website offers a wide range of melodies including songs, tones and other random sounds and effects. (The wallpaper is mixed with sentences.) The Google Play Store has an app for Android users that offers ringtones and wallpapers. The iPhone app, however, only offers wallpaper. Tones7 has a good range of ringtone types and a significant list of categories to make browsing for this perfect ringtone easier. However, they won't be top Billboard hits. Notification sounds provide melodies created on synthesizers. If you are looking for bleeps, whoops, and Martian cannon beams, this is the place for you. When downloading files from any website, keep legal considerations in mind. The content itself usually gives clues. For example, if the site has free tunes from the latest songs, topped the charts, it's probably best to stay away. The melodies allow you to express yourself beyond the normal chirp, chimes, and radar sounds everyone else uses. With a little effort, the songs you love will customize your iPhone experience. Ringtone can be any type of audio, from song parts to your own voice recordings. If you can make catchy clips you can build a profitable business. The process is simple and involves multiple costs, depending on the options you choose. Research tunes on the market to understand current trends. The information you collect will help you in creating clips that people are more likely to buy. You can check out trend tunes online on websites like Billboard, iTunes and Myxer. You can create a ringtone with one of the many sound editing programs available online, or for a fee. Some can be downloaded to your computer, while others only function on The program's instructions are usually easy to use. Popular programs include Audacity, AVS Melody Maker and audio file that you want to change should be stored on your computer. Open it with an editing program and use tools to select the start and end of the audio parts you want for the ringtone. The melodies are usually 30 seconds or less, and include the catchiest audio section. Save the clip as an MP3 for use on most mobile phones. If you decide to use an online editing program, upload the file to the provider's website and follow the instructions for creating the clip. There are many places to sell digital products online. Some of the websites that offer audio editing programs also provide stores or markets on the site where you can sell your work. Please note that many charge a fee for a service that can be calculated for listing or for selling. If you prefer to keep all profits, consider selling tunes through your website or blog by installing an e-commerce cart on your page. Content for Apple products is more regulated and only available through iTunes. If you want to sell iPhone tunes on iTunes, you must either have a catalog of at least 20 albums or sell through one of the company's Apple-approved aggregators. Aggregators format and deliver content to iTunes for a fee. They include distributor sites like Snipsell, Catapult and TuneCore. Many song tunes are from popular artists. However, keep in mind that it is illegal to use licensed work without the owner's permission. If you want to make tunes from a popular song, movie track or other copyrighted product, contact the creator or licensing company. Note that you will have to pay a royalty fee for each ringtone you sell containing the work. The first step in adding a ringtone to your phone is finding one that you like. Typically, this means checking out one of the dozens of ringtone sites on the web and choosing a good one that is compatible with the phone model. Some sites charge for the use of their tunes to cover songs royalty, among other things, and some sites provide tones for free. Many old songs (such as classic plays) have been around long enough that their copyright has expired - they've entered the public domain, so they're free for everyone to use. Once you have found the ringtone you like, you just have to get it in the phone's memory. There are several different ways to do this, depending on the specific model of the phone. Three main ways to add a new ringtone are: Advertising Download ringtone programs into your phone from your computer, through the data cable. Send the program to your phone. Enter the program directly into your phone using the keyboard. Phones can One particular method is exceptional, but many phones have multiple options. Check the instructions to find out what your phone can do. If you have the right phone, software and computer computer Downloading ringtones through a data link or infrared interface may be the easiest option, but it takes some work and costs to set everything up initially. A more popular method is to send a new ringtone to the phone on the air. This approach originated with Nokia, but other manufacturers have since added this feature to their phones. The basic idea is to send the phone a special kind of text message that contains a program for ringtone - in most phones, this is done using either a short messaging service or advanced messaging service technology. Nokia originally developed a short message service to send short text messages between phones. Later Nokia and Intel created an intelligent messenger, a special protocol for sending functional, non-textual information via SMS. Basically, smart SMS messages are coded to a equipped phone to recognize it as a graphic, ringtone, etc. The most common method of transmitting ringtones on the air is to visit the ringtone of the website, choose the tone, enter your phone number and let the site administrators send a message to your phone directly. Alternatively, you can use the SMS gateway website to send a specific message to your phone yourself. This means finding the code for the right ringtone, finding it in the appropriate format (such as Nokia binary format) and copying it as a smart message. Cell phones with the composer's melody allow you to enter into the melodies directly. The easiest way to use this feature is to find the appropriate keypress sequence for ringtone on the internet. This sequence will tell you which buttons to press on your phone, in composer mode, to program the ringtone you want (check the instructions for details about the composer's phone mode). Of course, in order for the ringtone to work, the sequence must be in the right format. Fortunately, you can find tons of sequences online for most phone models. As cell phones evolve, the ringtones will get more sophisticated as well. Some phones already boast a polyphonic ringtone, meaning the phone can play more than one note at a time, allowing for richer, more coherent ringtones. Some new phones allow you to record songs and voice messages for melodies yourself. Many of these models also allow you to assign different tunes to different incoming numbers, so you know who's calling you without even looking at your phone. Soon, the tunes will have graduated extraneous thrills on an important phone feature.
